Ideas Youth Committee Meeting 2 Summary

Overview

The Ideas Youth Committee (IYC) continued their engagement process at another interactive meeting. The second meeting was held on November 20, 2024 with in person and virtual options available. At the meeting, there was a brief presentation to update the IYC on Meeting 1 results and general project updates.

Then over twenty IYC members participated in an interactive activity building on the results gathered from the first meeting.

Main themes and ideas from meeting one were turned into intentions. This process involved combining similar ideas and converting them into actions. Some examples are below:



Visit City Park because it...

"Accessible" "Is easy and accessible" "Is free and publicly accessible..." "Is endless affordable fun"


Intention Categories

For the main activity, four existing core intentions of foundational planning were developed by the design team based on community input across the first three meetings. These four core intentions are used to guide the development of the City Park Master Plan.

The four core intentions listed below were shown on the activity as "baskets."

- -Present unified experience and welcome (Purple)
- -Adapat management of the park landscape to promote enhanced diversity and health (Green)
- -Reinforce the cultural integrity of the park and grow its capacity to be adaptable (Orange)
- -Ensure the park is safe, accessible, and convenient (Blue)





IYC members were asked to move their intention cans from the pantry into the existing core intention baskets if they felt like they matched that existing intention. The "cans" were based on the themes from IYC Meeting 1.


The cans contained phrases such as "bring people together", "promote a more sustainable future", "make accessible and affordable", and "cultivate a place to find inspiration" If they felt like certain intention "cans" didn't match a core intention "basket", they were able to put them in the "new basket".

Several of the cans were placed across different basket intentions. Notable overlaps included themes of fostering community, promoting inclusivity, and creating engaging and inspiring experiences, which each appeared in multiple categories.

For instance, "Foster stronger community and inclusivity" was linked to each of the four baskets showing the desire to create a park that welcomes the participation of all members of the New Orleans community. These patterns highlight both recurring priorities and innovative contributions from the IYC members.

Finalized Core Intentions

The chart below shows how IYC members chose to sort their intention "cans". While the original four intentions recieved most of the sorted cans, IYC members strongly felt that the original four intentions should be expanded and revised.



To end the meeting IYC members participated in a committee wide report out of the intentions they developed at their tables. These intentions were written onto ingredient sheets, read aloud, and placed into a gumbo pot in the center of the room.

They could write down the same intentions that were previously developed if they felt like there were sufficient, edit the wording of the existing intentions if they felt like they could be better, or write completely new intentions if they felt like something was missing.

The design team recieved several versions of the four original intentions. For example, "Adapat management of the park landscape to promote enhanced diversity and health" was changed to "Adapt the management of the landscape to enhance diversity, health, and the environment". New themes reflected IYC suggestions for interactivity, community bonding and educational experiences rooted in nature.



Crafting New Core Intentions

These ingredient sheets along with the notes on the table sheet activity were analyzed by the design team to create the next iteration of intentions to be presented at the public community meeting.

Common themes and ideas from the "New intention basket" were combined into a new fifth intention. All ideas, intentions, and notes are included in the appendix.

Foundational Planning Core Intentions

- Present a unified experience of welcome into the park
- Ensure the park is safe, accessible, & convenient
- Adapt the management of the landscape to enhance diversity & health
- Reinforce the cultural integrity of the park & grow its capacity to be adaptable



Next Steps

The next large scale community engagement meeting will take place on December 11th from 6:00-8:00 pm. This meeting will confirm the final core intentions developed from the feedback recieved in IYC Meeting 2 and start the conversation on place-making ideas within City Park. These core intentions will provide the base understanding of the park and its goals over the next two decades.

The final IYC meeting will be January 15th, 2025. This meeting will build off of the feedback on existing and future experiences that fit within each of the core intentions. Youth will be asked to pick specific places and analyze how they can be preserved, enhanced or added to the future City Park.

After Action Review

After the activity was completed, each participant was asked to fill out an After Action Review. The summary of their responses are below.

List 1-3 positive outcomes of the meeting.

Participated thought the meeting was inclusive, friendly, and engaging, allowing participants to voice their opinions, exchange creative ideas, and connect with new people. Key themes included collaboration, effective communication, flexibility in feedback, and a shared focus on improving the park with innovative features and safety enhancements.

Do you have any additional concerns, questions, or comments?

Concerns were raised about survey accessibility, inclusivity in demographic data, and addressing hydrology and construction needs, with a request for better communication about project timelines.

Do you have any suggestions for improvements?

Participants highlighted the importance of creating inclusive, engaging, and accessible spaces in the park, such as community spots, creative areas, and facilities for teens, elderly, and disabled individuals.

Other suggestions included improving maintenance, adding amenities like bathrooms, bus stops, and lighting, and fostering better community interaction.

- Please consider a skatepark would be great for teens to get active. Better maintenance of areas like underpasses. Additional parking lot for Tad Gormley (for farmer's market, football games, to practice) More bathrooms! Running trails that are not sketchy and more lighting

and maintenance.

- Engagement more but overall meeting was good.
- More swings, restaurants, gardens, fields to play softball and soccer, stores around the park, indoor sports facility, pavilions, place where people who enjoy being creative but don't want to be outside, not enough light, golf trails beginners and experts, emergency phones, maps, taste of NOLA
- More bus stops! More safe sidewalks/walking paths that are also accessible, especially for the elderly and the disabled.
- Maybe foster more participation with people you don't know, solidifying the sense of community.
- Create a more interactive activity
- Fix walkways and roads


